

This file with the list of the names of the 30 Alaska attorneys whom I have filed lengthy complaints against since December 20, 1993 which total about three boxes of stamped documents and transcripts over the same period of time that my husband Thomas S. Obermeyer, Attorney, licensed by similar Missouri Bar Exam since 1990, a state that has reciprocity with Alaska, has continued to resolutely pay for, study for, and take Alaska Bar Exam twice yearly 28 times for 84 days of his life, was the subject of a complaint by Mr. Stephen Van Goor, Alaska Bar Association Counsel since 1981 at Missouri Supreme Court at the end of August, 2004 against Tom's Missouri law license. Mr. Van Goor's name is on Page 1201 of In the Matter of the Application of Thomas S. Obermeyer, 57 American Law Reports 4th 1195, 717 Pacific Reporter 2d382 (Alaska 4/18/86).

Please contact Missouri Supreme Court c/o Ms. Maridee Farnquist Edwards, Chief Disciplinary Counsel, Missouri Supreme Court, 3335 American Avenue, Jefferson City, Missouri 65109-1079, (573)635-7400, (573)635-2240 Fax for further information. Missouri Supreme Court was silent by dismissal of Mr. Van Goor's complaint in November, 2004. Since Mr. Van Goor has continued to allege that I am in "contempt of court" in Alaska for posting the 30 names of Alaska attorneys even though we have not received any help in our efforts to obtain Tom's Alaska law license from Mr. Van Goor, I have removed the names as a gesture of good will toward Mr. Van Goor and the 30 Alaska attorneys. I respectfully ask Mr. Van Goor and the 30 Alaska attorneys who have made up issues against me to now assist Tom Obermeyer, Attorney, in his dedicated effort to be licensed to practice law in Alaska immediately after almost 21 1/2 years. Dear Mr. Obermeyer:

I was advised today that there is a listing of grievances that your wife, Theresa Obermeyer, has filed with the Alaska Bar Association that appears on the website sponsored by both of you. I confirmed that this document is located at: http://www.tobermeyer.info/ABA_B0004-5.pdf.

Alaska Bar Rule 22(b) provides that:

Complainants and all persons contacted during the course of the investigation have a duty to maintain confidentiality of discipline and disability proceedings prior to the initiation of formal proceedings subject to Bar Rule 21(c). It will be regarded as contempt of court to breach this confidentiality in any way. It will not be regarded as a breach of confidentiality for a person so contacted to consult with an attorney. A Respondent may waive confidentiality in writing and request disclosure of any information pertaining to the Respondent to any person or to the public.

Unless a respondent attorney consents to disclosure, an exception to confidentiality exists under Alaska Bar Rule 21 or the Alaska Supreme Court orders that a confidential disciplinary matter be made public, it is a violation of this rule of court to publicly disclose confidential disciplinary information. A knowing violation of a rule of court is a violation of Alaska Rule of Professional Conduct 3.4(c). Further, under Alaska Rule of Professional Conduct 8.4(a), “[i]t is professional misconduct for a lawyer to violate the rules of professional conduct, knowingly assist or induce another to do so, or do so through the acts of another.”



Within five days of the date of this letter, you must 1) advise this office that you have removed all disciplinary information that is confidential under Alaska Bar Rule 22(b) appearing *anywhere* on your website or 2) provide this office with written Alaska Bar Rule 22(b) confidentiality waivers by the attorneys whose confidential disciplinary information appears *anywhere* on your website or provide proof that an exception to confidentiality exists under Alaska Bar Rule 21 or provide proof that the Alaska Supreme Court has ordered that these confidential disciplinary matters be made public.

If you do not comply with either of these requirements, I will conclude that you are knowingly violating Alaska Bar Rule 22(b) and initiate a disciplinary investigation.

During the period between December 20, 1993 to present Theresa Nangle Obermeyer spent many years filing 30 lengthy complaints and responses against licensed Alaska attorneys which seem to have had no effect. Below is a summary of the 30 complaints as follows:

- (1.) December 20, 1993 against Mr. [REDACTED] Partner, Jermain, Dunnagan & Owens, for three years of fabrications while she held public office on Anchorage School Board 1990-94
- (2.) August 23, 1994 against Mr. [REDACTED] U.S. Attorney, District of Alaska, Anchorage and currently Partner, Dorsey & Whitney, for making up United States of America vs. Theresa Nangle Obermeyer No. A94-0074 CR.
- (3.) September 9, 1994 against Ms. [REDACTED], Assistant Federal Public Defender and currently Assistant U.S. Attorney, Anchorage, for her representation at Bail Hearing on August 22, 1994.
- (4.) September 9, 1994 against Mr. [REDACTED], Law Clerk for U.S. Magistrate Harry Branson, and currently Assistant Attorney General, Anchorage, for his fabrications under oath at the same "Bail Hearing."
- (5.) September 9, 1994 against Ms. [REDACTED], Federal Public Defender, and currently Attorney, Teamsters Local 959, Anchorage for her non-responsiveness regarding pending federal, criminal charges against Obermeyer.
- (6.) June 20, 1995 against Mr. [REDACTED], Violent Crimes Compensation Board Hearing Officer for Claim #95-069 held March 6, 1995 when Mr. Conheady was on probation by order of Alaska Supreme Court on February 17, 1995.
- (7.) July 7, 1995 against Mr. [REDACTED], Hughes, Thorsness, for chairing about six Municipal Board of Ethics Meetings against Obermeyer while she was in public office on Anchorage School Board.
- (8.) July 7, 1995 against Mr. [REDACTED], Solo Practice, Anchorage, for participating in about six Municipal Board of Ethics Meetings against Obermeyer while she held public office on Anchorage School Board.
- (9.) Mr. [REDACTED], Solo Practice, Eagle River, for holding about six Municipal Board of Ethics Meetings against Obermeyer while she held public office on Anchorage School Board.
- (10.) March 5, 1997 against Mr. [REDACTED], Attorney and Lobbyist, regarding his "No Contest" conviction for "Excess Campaign Contributions to the Pull-Tab and Bingo Industry" before Judge Michael Wolverton on May 15, 1995.
- (11.) October 8, 1997 against Ms. [REDACTED], Board of Directors, Chugach Electric Association, for Obermeyer's treatment on July 9, 1997.

- (12.) October 8, 1997 against Mr. [REDACTED], Board of Directors, Chugach Electric Association, for her treatment July 9, 1997.
- (13.) October 8, 1997 against Ms. [REDACTED], General Counsel, Chugach Electric Association, for her treatment on July 9, 1997.
- (14.) October 21, 1997 against Mr. [REDACTED], also General Counsel, Chugach Electric Association, for her treatment July 9, 1997.
- (15.) March 19, 1998 against Mr. [REDACTED], Municipal Attorney 1994-2000, now Partner, Hughes, Thorsness, for forwarding phony documents about February 20, 1998 at Hilton Anchorage that resulted in Obermeyer's arraignment in State of Alaska/Hilton Anchorage vs. Theresa Nangle Obermeyer 3AN-S98-2211 CR the next day, March 20, 1998.
- (16.) March 23, 1998 against Mr. [REDACTED], Alaska Attorney General, now Mayor, Juneau, for Obermeyer's arraignment in State of Alaska/Hilton Anchorage vs. Theresa Nangle Obermeyer 3ANS98-2211 CR.
- (17.) July 2, 1998 against Mr. [REDACTED] then Assistant State Public Defender, now Inactive Alaska Bar member, for his lack of advocacy when he was representing her.
- (18.) July 6, 1998 against Mr. [REDACTED] Bar Counsel, Alaska Bar Association, for giving Obermeyer a response to her Grievance against Mr. Mitchell Gravo dated March 12, 1997 on June 29, 1998 for the first time.
- (19.) August 17, 1998 against Mr. [REDACTED] Assistant Bar Counsel, for his rejection of her request for an investigation of Mr. Patrick Conheady, who was Hearing Officer for her complaint at Violent Crimes Compensation Board on March 6, 1996 even though he was on probation at Alaska Bar Association by order of Alaska Supreme Court.
- (20.) August 17, 1998 against Mr. [REDACTED] for his signed refusal on July 26, 1995 to review Mr. Conheady's actions as Hearing Officer while Conheady was on probation by Alaska Bar Association by order of Alaska Supreme Court.
- (21.) September 9, 1998 against Mr. [REDACTED], Assistant State Prosecutor, now State Senator, for his prosecution of State of Alaska/Hilton Anchorage vs. Theresa Nangle Obermeyer 3AN-S98-2211CR.
- (22.) September 21, 1998 against Mr. [REDACTED], current Partner, Davis, Wright & Tremaine, and Attorney, Hilton Anchorage, for his part in coaching all seven witnesses who were employees at Hilton Anchorage and sitting in the trial for seven days in State of Alaska/Hilton Anchorage vs. Theresa Nangle Obermeyer 3AN-S98-2211 CR.
- (23.) September 22, 1998 against Mr. [REDACTED] Board of Governors Alaska Bar Association, for the position his wife, Mrs. Dianne I. Brown, Alaska Commission of Judicial Conduct and the position of his partner, Art Perterson, also on Alaska Commission of Judicial Conduct, as he and his other partner, Ms. Mauri Long, wife of Superior Court Judge Phillip Volland, served on Board of Governors Alaska Bar Association.

(24.) October 7, 1998 against Ms. [REDACTED] Assistant State Prosecutor, and currently attorney, Alaska Parent and Youth Foundations, for her position as State Misdemeanor Prosecutor while Obermeyer had three claims with State of Alaska Violent Crimes Compensation Board, and while she was being prosecuted in State of Alaska/Hilton Anchorage vs. Theresa Nangle Obermeyer 3AN-S98-2211CR after her husband, Mr. Robert C. Bundy, was U.S. Attorney, prosecuted United States of America vs. Obermeyer, three non-jury, federal, criminal trials between September 26, 1994 and June 11, 1996.

(25.) October 7, 1998 against Mr. [REDACTED], Alaska District Attorney, for charging Obermeyer with “Harassment” in State of Alaska/Hilton Anchorage vs. Theresa Nangle Obermeyer 3AN-S98-2211 CR on March 16, 1998.

(26.) October 7, 1998 against Mr. [REDACTED], Hearing Officer, for his unfavorable ruling on April 23, 1996 of her Violent Crimes Compensation Board Claim #96-077 regarding her second assault on August 16, 1995 at Anchorage Federal Building.

(27.) October 7, 1998 against Mr. [REDACTED], then, Clerk, Alaska Supreme Court, who currently practices law in California, for composing File #64 on May 6, 1980 which was Ted Stevens’ blank application papers for admission by reciprocity to practice law in Alaska filed August 8, 1960.

(28.) January 18, 2000 against Ms. [REDACTED], Partner, Jermain, Dunnagan & Owens, for her fabrications against Obermeyer’s Valedictorian son in Thomas Obermeyer, Jr. vs. Anchorage School District 3AN-00-03908 CI and her part in Christal vs. Obermeyer 3AN-99-12271 CI.
