

1 THE CLERK: Raise your right hand.

2 JIM SINGLETON, PLAINTIFF'S WITNESS, SWORN

3 THE CLERK: Sir, please be seated in the witness box.

4 For the record, would you please state your full name, your
5 address, and spell your last name.

6 THE WITNESS: Very well. My name is Jim Singleton.
7 My address is 222 West Seventh Avenue -- in fact, down the
8 hall -- and my last name is spelled S-i-n-g-l-e-t-o-n.

9 THE CLERK: Thank you.

10 DIRECT EXAMINATION

11 BY MR. BOTTINI:

12 Q Good morning, Your Honor.

13 A Good morning.

14 Q Judge Singleton, you are a United States District Court
15 Judge here in the District of Alaska, are you not?

16 A I am.

17 Q All right. When were you appointed to the Federal Bench?

18 A Probably sometime in May of 1990. I took office in 1990.

19 Q All right. I'm wondering if you could recount for Judge
20 Enright your experience as a judicial officer before your
21 appointment to the Federal Bench.

22 A I was appointed to the Alaska Superior Court in November
23 of 1970 and took office in December of 1970. I stayed on the
24 State Superior Court until I was appointed to the Alaska Court
25 of Appeals, which is a court of criminal appeals. I nominally

1 took office when that Court was organized in September of
2 1980; however, I still had my trial calendar, so I didn't
3 begin doing that work full-time until probably February of
4 1981. And then I remained in that position until becoming a
5 United States District Judge in August of 1990.

6 Q All right, thank you. Are your chambers located here in
7 the Federal Building?

8 A Yes, they are. They're out that door and down the hall.

9 Q All right. Let me ask Deputy Marshall Guinn to hand you
10 an exhibit that's been marked as Number 1 for identification.

11 A Thank you.

12 Q Judge, does that diagram accurately depict the floor plan,
13 if you will, of Courtrooms 1, 2, and 3 and the chambers area
14 corresponding to this courtroom here in the Federal Building?

15 A Well, let me get organized here. All right. It appears
16 to, yes.

17 Q All right.

18 MR. BOTTINI: We'd move 1 into evidence, Your Honor.

19 THE COURT: Any objection?

20 MS. GEDDES: No objection, Your Honor.

21 THE COURT: It may be received as marked.

22 (Plaintiff's Exhibit 1 admitted)

23 BY MR. BOTTINI:

24 Q Could you show Judge Enright, Judge Singleton, where on
25 that diagram your chambers are located?

1 MR. BOTTINI: Call Judge Fabe, Your Honor.

2 (Pause)

3 THE CLERK: Would you please stand before me here to
4 be sworn.

5 THE WITNESS: Yes, ma'am.

6 THE CLERK: Raise your right hand.

7 DANA A. FABE, PLAINTIFF'S WITNESS, SWORN

8 THE CLERK: Would you please be seated in the witness
9 box, right over there. For the record, would you please state
10 your full name, your address, and spell your last name.

11 THE WITNESS: Yes. My name is Dana Anderson Fabe, F
12 as in Frank, a, b as in boy, e. And the address; my business
13 address is 303 K Street, Number 422, 99501, here in Anchorage.

14 THE CLERK: Thank you.

15 THE COURT: You may inquire, sir.

16 DIRECT EXAMINATION

17 BY MR. BOTTINI:

18 Q Good morning, Your Honor. Judge Fabe, you are a State
19 Superior Court Judge, are you not?

20 A Yes, I am.

21 Q And when were you appointed to the State Bench?

22 A In August of 1988.

23 Q The State Superior Court in the State of Alaska is basi-
24 cally a trial level court; is that correct?

25 A It's a court of general jurisdiction. It's the higher of

1 the two trial courts.

2 Q Are you also a member of the Joint Federal-State Court
3 Gender Equality Task Force?

4 A I am.

5 Q And how long have you been a member of that body?

6 A I first became involved with that body in March of '93,
7 when I went to a -- a national conference in Williamsburg
8 about setting up joint-federal -- setting up gender bias task
9 forces. And after I returned from that meeting, I was sent by
10 Chief Justice Moore of our State Supreme Court. I started to
11 attend the -- the ad hoc committee that was working on setting
12 up such a task force. And then when it was formally set up by
13 Chief Judge Holland and Chief Justice Moore, I was appointed
14 to be on that task force.

15 Q Let me direct your attention to the morning of June 29th,
16 1994. Was there a meeting of the task force scheduled for
17 that day?

18 A Correct.

19 Q All right. And where was that meeting to be held?

20 A In Judge Singleton's chambers.

21 Q All right. What time was the meeting scheduled for?

22 A The meetings are always at 7:15 a.m. on Wednesday morn-
23 ings. Not every Wednesday, but when they happen they're
24 generally Wednesday mornings at 7:15 a.m.

25 Q Did you attend the meeting that morning?

Dear Editor:

I filed a complaint against Judge Dana Fabe. Randal Simpson's wife who is Howard Trickey's law partner, with Alaska Commission on Judicial Conduct Oct. 3 for causing the incident on June 29 when she called Court Security Officers and U.S. Marshals on me after I had been invited to a Court Gender Equality Task Force Meeting by Tari Carns, 20 year employee Alaska Judicial Council. I was then jailed for the day while a federal criminal trial was fabricated against me. This is what one gets in this community for honesty and leadership. I must have so much credibility that a life appointed Judge William Enright, U.S. District Court, San Diego, was flown up here for the trial Sept. 26-28, rather than one of the five life appointed U.S. District Court judges locally trying this trumped up case. Two local judges, life appointed Judge James Singleton U.S. District Court, and Judge Fabe, Superior Court, plus other highly paid highly court personnel testified against me. Why was I invited to the meeting June 29 when it was obvious from the testimony at the trial that I was not welcome? The taxpayers' money has been squandered flagrantly to discredit me instead of focusing on the corruption in Alaska Bench and Bar and Anchorage School District that I uncovered during my term on the Anchorage School Board, 1990 through May 9, 1994. On Oct. 4 an appeal was tiled to U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, San Francisco, as regards my criminal conviction in my non-jury trial that was rendered by Judge Enright.

I ask that our children not be used to advance a political agenda. The Anchorage School District pays probably about \$100,000 a year to the Anchorage Daily News for advertising. I have documentation that if proven would not retain Bob Cristal for cause immediately. I brought it to U.S. Attorney in the beginning of June 1994 and rather than the new since February 1994 U.S. Attorney Robert C. Bundy, researching my allegations, I was jailed June 29. Mr. Cristal hired six new principal positions in August 1994, making the number a total of 16 over the minimum according to Northwest Accreditation Standards at the same time teachers were being laid off and class sizes for our 47,300 children were raised. This foremost educator in our state has only worked in the Anchorage School District for almost 26 years and leads by double talk and check distribution.
