In receipt of your signature five times denying the sealing of my "Interested Person Report," my response is that HB 203 which is entitled: "Expungement of Certain Criminal Records" [http://www.legis.state.ak.us/basis/get\\_bill.asp?bill=HB%20203&session=26](http://www.legis.state.ak.us/basis/get_bill.asp?bill=HB%20203&session=26) is not possible. I would like to know on what basis anyone can have his/her "Interested Person Report" sealed. I refer you specifically to A.S. 62.180(b):

"A person may submit a written request to the head of the agency responsible for maintaining past conviction or current offender information . . ." (Emphasis added.)

I do not have a "past conviction" nor am now a "current offender." The most recent issue is #1 dated June 26, 2003. Therefore, I am amazed that you, Ms. Kathryn Monfreda, Ms. Adrienne Bachman, and Captain Miller all denied my request to have the fabricated documents in my "Interested Person Report" sealed. I submitted lengthy documents in an effort to be complete. I should not even have an "Interested Person Report" at all based on the wording of A.S. 62.180(b).

You are the final administrative authority based on A.S. 62.180 (b) the last sentence:

"The decision of the head of the agency is the final administrative decision on the request."

The purpose of this entire exercise is to clear "my good name" in order that I may seek gainful employment.

Additionally, if Alaska Department of Public Safety has any other documents in your files regarding "my good name," please forward them to me so that my records are complete.

Please reconsider your incorrect decision to seal my fabricated "Interested Person Report" based on A.S. 62.180(b).
