RE:Financial Accounting as Regards My Two Assaults and Jailings and Two Fabricated Trials of September 26-28, 1994 and November 27, 1995 continued to January 10-11, 1996

Dear Senator Murkowski:

Per my conversation with Ms. Heller on January 23, this is to request a financial report and possible investigation of the unbelievable treatment I have received by life appointed federal judges, U.S. Attorneys, federal employees, and contract employees at Anchorage Federal Building since June 29, 1994. The case numbers are #A94-0074 CR WBE, #A95-0082 CR HRH, U.S. Court of Appeals for Ninth Circuit No. 94-30368, and U.S. Supreme Court No. 95-6843. Enclosed are a "Letters to Editor," Anchorage Daily News, May 9, 1993, Alaska Journal of Commerce, October 31, 1994 about these issues, a list of participants in my first trial dated December 1, 1994, and a tape recording that proves Senator Stevens' direct participation in my treatment.

My two assaults and jailings were June 29, 1994 and August 16, 1995. Two non-jury, made up trials were held against my good name September 26-28, 1994 and November 27, 1995 continued to January 10-11, 1996. The list is incomplete as I do not know all of the court reporters, secretaries, and support staff at Anchorage Federal Building and other federal agencies. I have dealt with a whole building of people and support staff in other parts of the country who work together every day. It is my wish to make an example out of myself in this matter in order that others who possibly do not understand the courts, judges, and lawyers as well as I do will not suffer the same fate.

BACKGROUND-MOTIVES OF SENATOR STEVENS

Please read Application of Theodore F. Stevens for Admission to the Alaska Bar Association, 355 Pacific Reporter 2d 164 (Alaska 1960) and In the Matter of the Application of Thomas S. Obermeyer, 717 Pacific Reporter 2d 382, 57 American Law Reports 4th 1195 (Alaska 1986). If you review Senator Stevens' own Pacific Reporter case 25 years before my husband's case was published in the same Reporter, Senator Stevens was not licensed in another state but applied here for reciprocity as per my first "Letter" about this, Anchorage Daily News, May 9, 1993 enclosed which was the date of my first public writing about our conclusion that Senator Stevens' own case directly related to Tom's inability to be licensed here. I do not believe that Senator Stevens ever in his life has taken a bar exam and am convinced he was admitted here in 1960 under false pretenses. Senator Stevens incriminated himself as per the enclosed tape recording of October 28, 1994 at Alaska World Affairs Council and has proven to me that the issues I have raised are accurate.
